Combining that with another side of <u>falling</u> household income, Americans are in a tougher spot than they have been in for years. Thanks to *Bidenflation*, Thanksgiving is far more expensive than it was in November 2020, the last Thanksgiving under a Republican Administration.

COUNTING THE COST

Navigating the Costly Culinary Landscape:

Families are also finding it harder to reunite with loved ones thanks to *Bidenomics*' disastrous policies. Before families even have to worry about food prices, the 55.4 million Americans who are <u>expected</u> to travel for Thanksgiving this year have found it increasingly more expensive to reach their final destination. Compared to Thanksgiving 2020, airline fares have <u>soared</u> by 15.1 percent, while gas prices have <u>risen</u> 59.8 percent.

For those hosting Thanksgiving or contributing to dinner, the outlook is not much better. With 62 percent of Americans <u>living</u> paycheck to paycheck, it is becoming increasingly difficult to cook for a family to celebrate the holiday. Since Biden took office, inflation has <u>increased</u> by 17.1 percent, interest rates have <u>climbed</u>, and the American economy is expected to <u>perform</u> worse.
