When asked to defend a massive spending agenda, President Biden said:

Norwich, CT is tossing \$30,000 from the American Rescue Plan at expanding a disc golf course to 18 holes – part of a larger effort that includes <u>upgrading a playground</u>, <u>tennis court improvements</u>, <u>and building outdoor exercise stations</u>.

We assume the city will be getting a call soon from Senator Dick Durbin (D-IL) who had this to say earlier this week:

"I met with a group of mayors over the weekend and county officials. And I warned them months ago when we put this money on the table that I didn't want to hear about the world's greatest frisbee park being built as a result of it -- do something serious that we can defend."

That's the problem: there's not much defensible about the American Rescue Plan. It spent less than 9% of its money on combatting COVID and then opened the door to hundreds of billions in waste and abuse of federal tax dollars.
