1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-	
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,	
3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; FINDINGS.	
4 (a) Short Title.—This Act may be cited as the	
5 [" Act of 2024"].	
6 (b) Findings.—The House of Representatives finds	

7 the following:

1	(1) Congress often designates certain spending
2	as "emergency", which means it does not count
3	against budget authority limits. This designation,
4	however, is a "gimmick" that does result in more
5	"outlays" and is specifically designed to increase
6	Federal spending.
7	(2) This practice undermines the original intent
8	of creating a special designation for emergency
9	spending—i.e., to streamline the process for moving
10	these funds quickly through Congress and to the cri-
11	sis at hand.
12	(3) Emergency designations are exempt from
13	fiscal constraints, including requirements to offset
14	spending. Waiving budgetary accountability meas-
15	ures and rules should be rare and used only as a last
16	resort.
17	(4) Circumventing budget spending caps dis-
18	torts our true fiscal condition and reduces the much-
19	needed transparency and accountability that we owe
20	taxpayers.
21	SEC. 2. REQUIREMENT WITH RESPECT TO STATEMENT DE-
22	SCRIBING EMERGENCY REQUIREMENTS
23	UPON INTRODUCTION.
24	Section 314(d) of the Congressional Budget and Im-
25	poundment Control Act of 1974 (2 U.S.C. 645(d)) is

- 1 amended by adding at the end the following new para-
- 2 graph:
- 3 "(3)(A) A bill or joint resolution may not be intro-
- 4 duced in the House of Representatives unless the sponsor
- 5 submits for printing in the Congressional Record a state-
- 6 ment setting forth any amounts in the bill or joint resolu-
- 7 tion designated as an emergency requirement pursuant to
- 8 section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) or section 252(e) of the Balanced
- 9 Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 and
- 10 an explanation of how any such amounts are being used
- 11 for the purpose of an unanticipated emergency as such
- 12 terms are defined in sections 250(c)(20) and 250(c)(21)
- 13 of such Act or a statement that the bill or joint resolution
- 14 contains no amounts designated as an emergency require-
- 15 ment.
- 16 "(B) With respect to each fiscal year, the chair of
- 17 the Committee on the Budget of the House of Representa-
- 18 tives shall, on a quarterly basis, cause to be published in
- 19 the Congressional Record the cumulative amount of all
- 20 such amounts designated as an emergency requirement as
- 21 described in subparagraph (A) for such fiscal year.".
