A BILL

To amend the Congressional Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974 to establish a point of order in the House of Representatives against the consideration of a general appropriation bill or a bill or joint resolution providing for continuing appropriations that causes the applicable allocation of outlays pursuant to a concurrent resolution on the budget for a fiscal year to be exceeded, and for other purposes.

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1	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; FINDINGS.
2	(a) Short Title.—This Act may be cited as the
3	[" Act of 2024"].
4	(b) FINDINGS.—The House of Representatives finds
5	the following:
6	(1) When Congress passes a budget resolution
7	or deeming resolution, it empowers the Budget Com-
8	mittee to set a top line spending limit (both budget
9	authority and outlays) for the Appropriations Com-
10	mittee (known as the 302(a) allocation). The Appro-
11	priations Committee then subdivides and allocates
12	those amounts (both budget authority and outlays)
13	to its 12 subcommittees (known as 302(b) suballoca-
14	tions) which must add up to the respective total
15	302(a) allocations.
16	(2) If an appropriations measure or amendment
17	is brought to the floor and proposes to spend more
18	on budget authority than its suballocation, a point
19	of order can be raised against it. However, there is
20	no point of order in the House if an appropriations
21	bill or amendment exceeds the applicable 302(b)
22	suballocation of outlays.
23	(3) By establishing caps on both budget author-
24	ity and outlays in appropriations measures, this

measure aims to enhance the transparency and in-

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1	tegrity of the appropriations process and ensure sus-
2	tainable fiscal controls.
3	SEC. 2. POINT OF ORDER WITH RESPECT TO CERTAIN
4	MEASURES THAT CAUSE AN OUTLAY BREACH.
5	Section 302(f)(1) of the Congressional Budget and
6	Impoundment Control Act of 1974 (2 U.S.C. 633(f)(1))
7	is amended—
8	(1) by striking "After the Congress has com-
9	pleted" and inserting "(A) After the Congress has
10	completed";
11	(2) by redesignating subparagraphs (A) through
12	(C) as clauses (i) through (iii), respectively; and
13	(3) by adding at the end the following new sub-
14	paragraph:
15	"(B) After the Congress has completed action
16	on a concurrent resolution on the budget for a fiscal
17	year, it shall not be in order in the House of Rep-
18	resentatives to consider a general appropriation bill
19	or a bill or joint resolution providing for continuing
20	appropriations, or an amendment thereto, or con-
21	ference report thereon, that would cause the applica-
22	ble allocation of outlays made under subsection (a)
23	or (b) for the first fiscal year or the total of fiscal
24	vears to be exceeded.".
