ABOUT MIKE FRANC

Mike is a longtime veteran of Washington, DC policymaking. He previously served as Chief Research Officer at the Foundation for Research on Equal Opportunity (FREOPP) where he advanced the policy agenda in areas including healthcare, K-12 education, higher-ed, housing, energy, welfare and economics. Franc also served as a research fellow at the Hoover Institution from 2015-2020.



Prior to joining the Hoover Institution, Franc served as policy director and counsel for House Majority Leader Kevin McCarthy and as the Vice President of government relations for the Heritage Foundation from 1997–2013.

He also served as communications director for former House Majority Leader Dick Armey (R–TX) and worked for the U.S. Department of Education and the Office of National Drug Control Policy. He has been quoted widely in the media, was a regular contributor to The National Review Online, and published in many publications such as the Financial Times.

Franc has a Bachelor of Arts in History from Yale University and a Juris Doctor from Georgetown University. He has four adult children and lives in Washington, DC.
