Reverse the Curse: U.S. House Budget Resolution (FY24-FY33)

Resetting and Restraining Discretionary Spending:

Our budget resolution sets FY 2024 discretionary spending at \$1.471 trillion (pre-Covid inflation levels) which is an 8 percent reduction (\$131 billion) from FY 2023 in accordance with the Limit, Save, Grow Act. Our budget also proposes a cap on spending growth at 1 percent for FY 2024 through the remaining budgetary window.

Removing One-Time Spending from the Baseline:

Our budget resolution also encourages eliminating budgetary gimmicks that assume one-time funding continues in perpetuity. Part of this assumption includes not extending the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, which put forth billions for Green New Deal projects like:

- **\$6.4 billion** for the new Carbon Reduction Program.
- **\$5 billion** for the National Electric Vehicle Formula Program.
- **\$5 billion** for electric and low emitting buses and ferries.
- **\$5.6 billion** for low or no emissions bus projects.

Rooting Out Woke and Wasteful Spending:

The federal government's increase in discretionary spending has been driven by partisan policies pushed by President Biden and Congressional Democrats, including:

- **Over \$1 billion** to the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) to police "political extremism."
- **\$25 million** for the Global Equity Fund.
- **\$385 million** for green energy subsidies at the State Department.

Refocusing on National Priorities:

Our budget resolution prioritizes national defense spending at the Pentagon to confront various worldwide threats, while also proposing ample border security at DHS to stop the flow of illegal immigration and deadly drugs from coming across the southern border.
