

Debt Tracking Report for May 28th, 2024

The gross national debt is currently **\$34.58 trillion**. This equates to:

- \$103,746 per person in the U.S.
- \$263,076 per household in the U.S.
- \$478,076 per child in the U.S

When President Biden took office total gross debt was **\$27.75 trillion**, meaning he has increased the national debt by **\$6.83 trillion**. This equates to:

- \$20,479 more debt per person in the U.S.
- \$51,929 more debt per household in the U.S.
- \$94,368 more debt per child in the U.S.

The rate of debt accumulation during the Biden Administration has equaled:

- \$170.63 billion in new debt per month
- \$5.6 billion in new debt per day
- \$233.29 million in new debt per hour
- \$3.89 million in new debt per minute
- \$64,804 in new debt per second

The debt one year ago was **\$31.46 trillion**, meaning that the debt has increased by **\$3.11 trillion** over the past 12 months. The rate of increase since one year ago has equaled:

- \$259.43 billion in new debt per month
- \$8.53 billion in new debt per day
- \$355.38 million in new debt per hour
- \$5.92 million in new debt per minute
- \$98,717 in new debt per second
