Page 2, line 12, strike “\$664,000,000,000” and insert “\$677,000,000,000”.

Page 2, line 17, strike “\$680,119,000,000” and insert “\$711,000,000,000”.

Strike section 101(b) (and redesignate subsequent subsections accordingly).

In section 201(b)(1), after “for current law mandatory budget authority and outlays,” insert “and the allocation made under section 203.”

Insert after section 202 the following (and redesignate section 203 as section 204):

**1 SEC. 203. SEPARATE ALLOCATION FOR OVERSEAS CONTIN-**  
**2 GENCY OPERATIONS/GLOBAL WAR ON TER-**  
**3 RORISM.**

**4 (a) IN GENERAL.**—In the House of Representatives,  
**5** there shall be a separate allocation of new budget author-  
**6** ity and outlays provided to the Committee on Appropria-  
**7** tions for the purposes of Overseas Contingency Oper-  
**8** ations/Global War on Terrorism for fiscal years 2020 and

1 2021, which shall be deemed to be an allocation under sec-  
2 tion 302(a) of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974. Sec-  
3 tion 302(a)(3) of such Act shall not apply to such separate  
4 allocation. Such separate allocations shall be as follows:

5 (1) For fiscal year 2020, \$73,000,000,000.

6 (2) For fiscal year 2021, \$60,000,000,000.

7 (b) SECTION 302 ALLOCATIONS.—The separate allo-  
8 cation referred to in subsection (a) shall be the exclusive  
9 allocation for Overseas Contingency Operations/Global  
10 War on Terrorism under section 302(b) of the Congres-  
11 sional Budget Act of 1974. The Committee on Appropria-  
12 tions of the House of Representatives may provide sub-  
13 allocations of such separate allocation under such section  
14 302(b).

15 (c) APPLICATION.—For purposes of enforcing the  
16 separate allocation referred to in subsection (a) under sec-  
17 tion 302(f) of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974, the  
18 “first fiscal year” and the “total of fiscal years” shall be  
19 deemed to refer to fiscal year 2020 and 2021 (as the case  
20 may be). Section 302(e) of such Act shall not apply to  
21 such separate allocation.

22 (d) DESIGNATIONS.—New budget authority or out-  
23 lays shall only be counted toward the allocation referred  
24 to in subsection (a) if designated pursuant to section

1 251(b)(2)(A)(ii) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency  
2 Deficit Control Act of 1985.

3 (e) ADJUSTMENTS.—For purposes of subsection (a)  
4 for fiscal year 2020 or 2021, no adjustment shall be made  
5 under section 314(a) of the Congressional Budget Act of  
6 1974 if any adjustment would be made under section  
7 251(b)(2)(A)(ii) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency  
8 Deficit Control Act of 1985.

In section 204 (as so redesignated), by striking  
“Sections 201 and 202” and inserting “Sections 201,  
202, and 203”.

6 ister certification that laws are enacted that reduce direct  
7 spending to offset the total increase in the discretionary

9 rity category and the revised nonsecurity category pro-  
10 vided by subsection (a) of such section.

11 (b) FISCAL YEAR 2021.—The amendment made by  
12 subsection (a) relating to fiscal year 2021 may not take

At the end of title I, add the following:

1 **SEC. 102. SENSE OF CONGRESS TO RESTORE FISCAL RE-**  
2 **SPONSIBILITY.**

3 Is it the sense of Congress that—

4 (1) statutory controls on discretionary spending  
5 shall continue after fiscal year 2021;

6 (2) reductions in mandatory spending shall be  
7 enacted to offset any increases in discretionary  
8 spending;

9 (3) significant budget process reform legislation  
10 shall be enacted to provide certainty in the budget  
11 and appropriations process and ensure that the  
12 budget and appropriations process is more effective  
13 and efficient;

14 (4) Government waste, fraud, and abuse should  
15 be addressed in a bipartisan manner; and

16 (5) Congress takes required measures to halt  
17 unsustainable Government spending that is leading  
18 to the expanding national debt.
